Population density is the average number of people living per square mile/km. A high population density implies that the population is high relative to the size of the country. It is seen that a rising global population density could lead to a strain on resources, food shortages, congestion and loss of the environment. However, some people believe that this rise in population density has been consistent with rising living standards and a better quality of life.

Some of the main benefits of higher density are those realized from reducing private car travel. On a city-wide scale, areas with higher densities, well-mixed land uses, accessible and connected transport options demonstrate less **reliance** on private cars. These higher density areas show a greater number of people walking, using public transport, cycling and spending less time commuting. Hence, a city experiencing a population boom needs to boost and update its infrastructure, figure out ways to have more efficient forms of public transportation, and determine the best ways to comfortably house all these people.

In addition, increasing the number of people in an area provides the support many businesses need to survive, as well as demand for other amenities such as swimming pools, libraries, schools, hospitals, parks, public transit, and the neighborhood pub. Higher density and mixed land use also provides for the ageing population to shift from family dwellings to smaller **ones** in the same neighborhoods where they raised their families. With more people able to happily fit into a smaller area, the pressures contributing to sprawl are reduced and the countryside may be preserved.

Higher-density cities definitely do bring their own benefits and negative consequences. But if city officials are prepared, they have the ability to do more good than harm.
