If you spend time doing all fun or enjoyable things, you'll be really happy, won't you? Maybe not. For most people, only doing things for fun isn't enough for real happiness. According to author of "*Happiness by Design*" Paul Dolan, happiness depends on a pleasure-purpose balance. What you do for pleasure might make yourself happy. However, you also need purpose to be truly happy in your life.

We may know what is enjoyable, but to know what brings meaning may require more thought. For example, pilots are said to have jobs with clear purpose. They're responsible for hundreds of people and fly all over the world, but they often have to spend time in boring hotels or stuck in airports and they perform routine actions hundreds of times. Those activities mightn't feel like they have meaning, and **they** are probably not fun, either. So pilots need balance in their work and life to be happy.

It's easy to do well in subjects you enjoy, but much less motivating in subjects you dislike, so you need to find a sense of purpose. You can't always choose to do only favorite subjects, so try to be part of a study team, finding others who also find that subject difficult. Each person can study one part until they understand it then teach it to the others. What you do might be **motivating** because they work towards a better community. The purpose becomes about helping the team or you can find purpose in your making progress. Now you need to find balance. First decide what things in life bring you pleasure and purpose. Then design your life so you do as many of them as possible. Some parts of our lives are the result of good or bad luck, but we can still design the parts that are under our control to maximize happiness.
