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| 1. bleed (v) | /bli:d/ | : lose blood (chảy máu) |
| → bleeding (n) | /'bli:diŋ/ | Ex: Some of these remedies can cause internal <i>bleeding</i> . |
| → blood (n) | /blʌd/ | : the red liquid that flows through the bodies of humans and animals |
| → bloody (adj) | /'blʌdi/ | : covered with blood |
| → bloodily (adv) | | |
| 2. bruise (n) | /bru:z/ | : an injury which appears as a purple mark on your body (vết thâm tím) |
| → bruise (v) | | : cause sb or sth to have a bruise |
| 3. childish (adj) | /'tʃaɪldɪʃ/ | : connected with or typical of a child |
| | | Ex: <i>childish</i> handwriting |
| | | : behaving in a stupid or silly way |
| | | = immature |
| | | Ex: They cannot be allowed to get away with such <i>childish</i> behaviour. |
| → childishly (adv) | | |
| → childlike (adj) | /'tʃaɪldlɪk/ | : having the qualities that children usually have, especially innocence |
| | | Ex: All her life she had a <i>childlike</i> trust in other people. |
| 4. confuse (v) | /kən'fju:z/ | : cause sb to feel uncertain or unclear (gây nhầm lẫn, làm rối rắm) |
| → confused (adj) | /kən'fju:zd/ | Ex: She seemed <i>confused</i> by the question. |
| → confusedly (adv) | | |
| → confusing (adj) | /kən'fju:zɪŋ/ | Ex: The instructions on the box are very <i>confusing</i> . |
| → confusingly (adv) | | |
| → confusion (n) | /kən'fju:ʒn/ | : uncertainty |
| → in confusion | | ≠ clarity, certainty |
| 5. cross (adj) | /krɒs/ | : annoyed or angry (bực mình) |
| | | Ex: My Dad gets <i>cross</i> (with me) if I leave the kitchen in a mess. |
| → cross (v) | | : make sb angry, annoy sb |
| 6. cruel (to sb / sth) (adj) | /'kru:əl/ | : having a desire to cause physical or mental pain and make sb suffer (độc ác, tàn nhẫn) |
| | | ≠ kind |
| cruelty (to sb / sth) (n) | /'kru:əlti/ | ≠ kindness |
| 7. embarrassed (adj) | /ɪm'bærəst/ | : shy, uncomfortable or ashamed, especially in a social situation |
| → embarrassedly (adv) | | |

→ embarrassing (adj)	/ɪm'bærəsɪŋ/	: making you feel shy, uncomfortable or ashamed
→ embarrassingly (adv)		
→ embarrass (v)	/ɪm'bærəs/	: make sb feel shy, uncomfortable or ashamed (gây lúng túng)
→ embarrassment (n)	/ɪm'bærəsmənt/	
8. envious (of sb / sth) (adj)	/'enviəs/	: wanting to be in the same situation as sb else; wanting sth that sb else has (thèm muốn, ghen tị) = jealous Ex: They were <i>envious</i> of his success.
→ envy (v)	/'envi/	
→ envy (n)		= jealousy (n)
9. genetic disorder (n)	/dʒə'netɪk dɪs'ɔ:də(r)/	: a health problem caused by one or more abnormalities in the genome (chứng rối loạn gen)
10. relieved (adj)	/rɪ'li:vd/	: feeling happy because sth unpleasant has stopped or has not happened; showing this (thanh thản, nhẹ nhõm) ≠ worried, anxious
→ relieve (v)	/rɪ'li:v/	: remove or reduce an unpleasant feeling or pain (làm dịu, làm nhẹ bớt)
→ relief (n)	/rɪ'li:f/	
11. separately (adv)	/'seprətli/	: not together (riêng lẻ, riêng biệt)
→ separate (from sb/sth) (adj)	/'seprət/	: different; not connected
→ separate (v)	/'sepəreɪt/	: divide into parts
→ separation (n)	/,sepə'reɪʃn/	
12. sprain (v)	/spreɪn/	: injure a joint in your body, especially your wrist or ankle, by suddenly twisting it: bong gân; trật (chân, tay)
→ sprain (n)		
13. stereotype (n)	/'steriətaɪp/	: a fixed idea or image that many people have of a particular type of person or thing, but which is often not true in reality
14. suspicious (of/about sb / sth) (adj)	/sə'spɪʃəs/	: feeling that sb has done sth wrong, illegal or dishonest, without having any proof (ngghi ngờ)
→ suspiciously (adv)		
→ suspicion (n)	/sə'spɪʃən/	= doubt
→ suspect (sb of sth) (v)	/sə'spekt/	
→ suspect (n)	/'sʌspekt/	: người bị tình nghi
15. upset (about/at/over sth)/ (with sb) (adj)	/,ʌp'set/	: worried, unhappy, or angry ≠ calm
→ upset (v)		: make sb worried, unhappy, or angry
