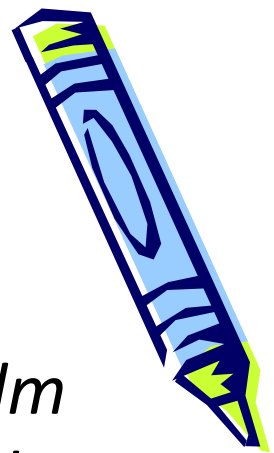


# Adjective forms of verbs

- Example:
- Form:  Present participle: V-ing  
Past participle: V-ed
- Usage: **v-ing:**
  - having active meaning
  - the subject causing the action
  - describe the nature of people/things**V-ed:**
  - having passive meaning
  - the subject affected by another objects
  - express people's attitude or feelings



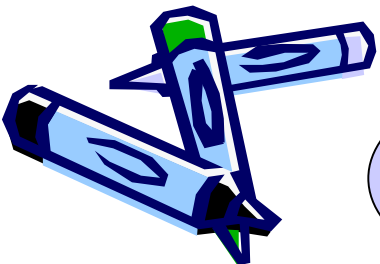
# Example:



Situation:

*A boy is watching a film which is about a ghost lake*

- The ghost in the film makes the boy horrified
- The ghost is really horrifying for him to watch



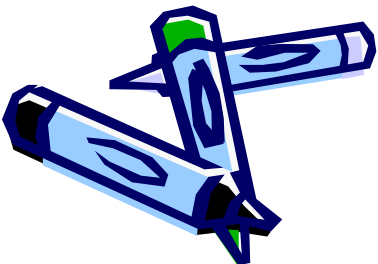
Horrrify

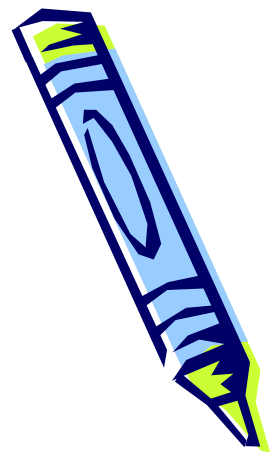

# It was not until ... that ...



- Example:

- I did not know how to ride bicycle

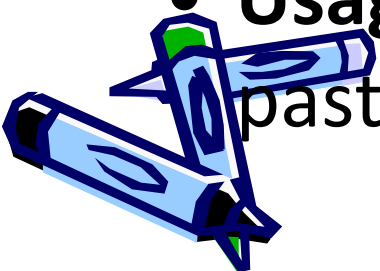
until I went to high school.

⇒ It was not until I went to high school that I knew  
how to ride bicycle.

- Form:

It was not until + point of time/clause + that + clause

- Usage: to *emphasize the point of time* in the past when some events happened

⇒ *Vietnam did not join the WTO until 2006*

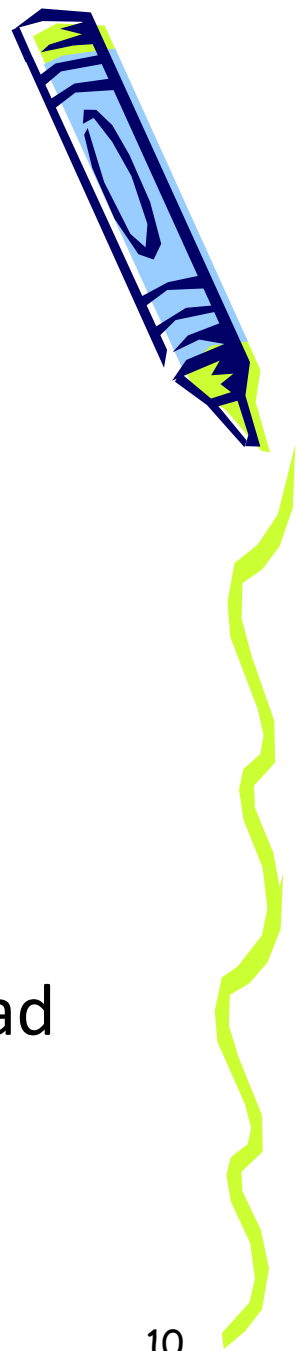

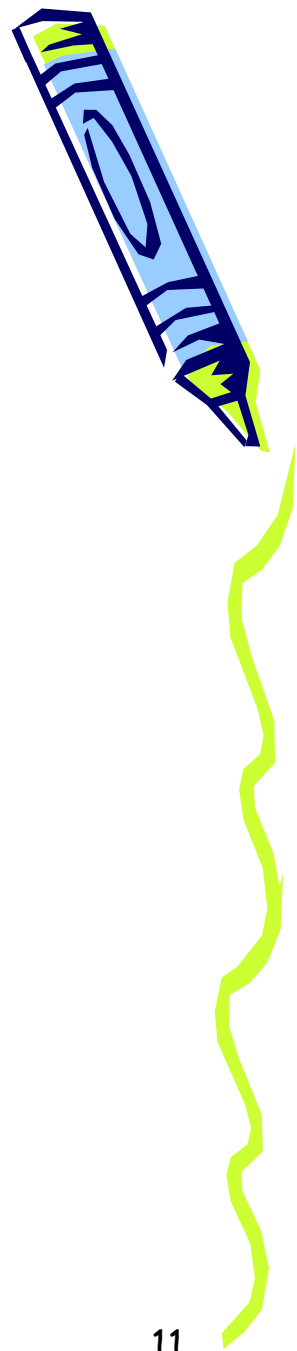

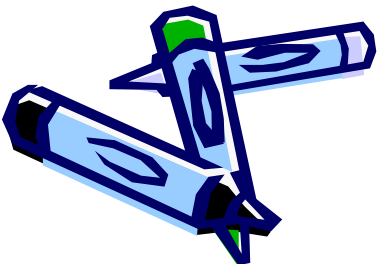
# Articles: A/an/the



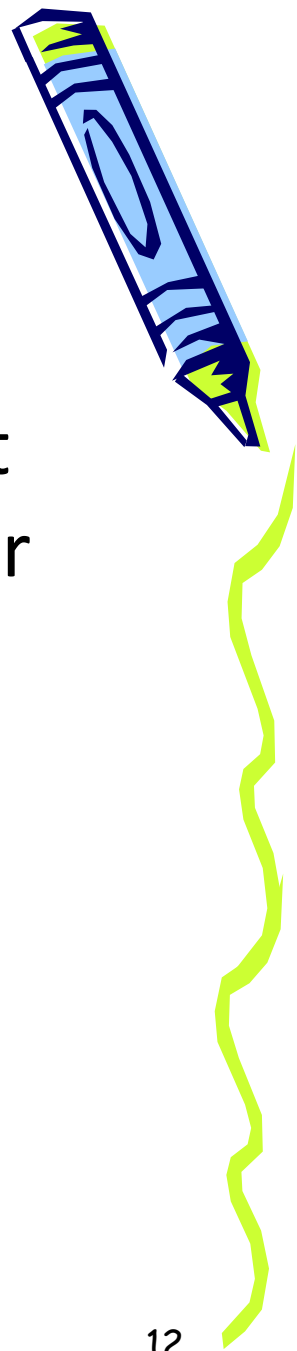
## 1. Definition:

Words that stand before Ns to indicate the type of reference being made by a N

- A/an: Indefinite articles + singular Ns
  - A + Ns begin with consonants
  - An + Ns begin with vowels
- The: definite articles + singular/plural Ns

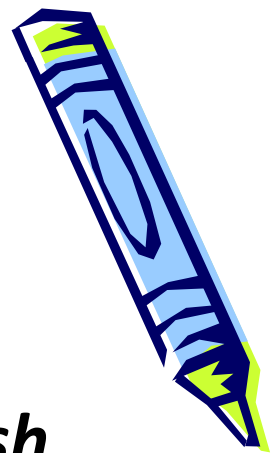


# Usage

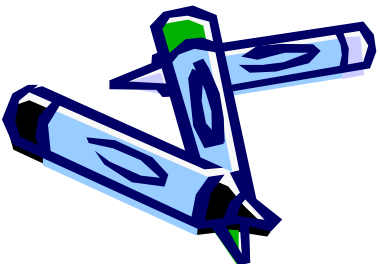


- We use a/an to talk about something at the first time or indefinite thing (listener doesn't know about it)
- We use the to refer something at the second time or definite thing (both speaker and listener can get what it means)





- Yesterday I bought a dictionary and an English book. The dictionary is expensive and the English book is cheaper.
- The earphone on the table belongs to my brother.
