As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, school has moved online for many students. This means more time sitting and staring at a screen. In addition to school, teenagers are also spending a significant amount of time socializing, playing games, and shopping virtually. This over-use of technology (11) _____ the mental and physical health of young people across the country, as well as right here at Becton.

Becton’s Student Assistance Coordinator, Mr. Connor Wills stresses that “ (12) _____, their brain stops developing and it is hard to change habits and learn new skills.” It is for this reason that children need to learn how to manage their emotions and not become too dependent on technology.

(13) _____ and their purpose. While computers are normally used during class time, cell phones are used to keep in touch with friends. According to Science Daily, “One in five young people regularly wake up in the night to send or check messages on social media.” Teenagers that do this are three times more likely to be tired at school, compared to those who do not log on a night.

Studies have shown that females are more likely to log onto their social media accounts than boys leading to emotional issues. Citing a study from 2015, Jamie Zelazny, a professor at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine explains that “ (14) _____ more than two hours a day were much more likely to report poor mental health outcomes like depression, and even suicide.”

Unfortunately, these habits tend to form at a much younger age. The American Association of Pediatrics states that there should be “avoidance of screens (15) _____ (except for video-chatting), and limits of an hour per day of high-quality programming for children up to the age of five.”

Egypt travel guide

♦ **Culture:** Courtesy and hospitality are important when doing business in Egypt. The host of a business meeting will usually offer tea or a small snack before commencing. It's polite to refuse the first offer, but once the host insists, the guest should then accept.

Throughout the Arab world, it is considered bad manners either to display anger or to openly criticize another person in public. In social life, punctuality is almost laughable. For business, visitors should be on time but expect locals to be often late, and do not take offence.

♦ **Economy:** On taking power in 1970, Anwar al-Sadat introduced a policy of '*infitah*' (openness) towards investment. Egypt's economy underwent rapid growth during the 1970s with the quick expansion of the oil industry, tourism and the Suez Canal, and **it** has continued to expand in subsequent decades.

The tourist sector is expanding rapidly, particularly along the Red Sea and Mediterranean coasts, despite sporadic terrorist activities of Islamic fundamentalists. Agriculture, which relies on irrigation from the Nile River, employs one-third of the working population.

♦ **Internet:** There are lots of internet cafés in the main cities, including Cairo, Alexandria, Dahab and Luxor. Even small, more remote towns including Siwa will have at least one venue, usually in the market area. Internet connection is usually **reliable**. Tourists can also access the Internet in hotels, with in-room Wi-Fi available, though often at a costly price.

♦ **Media:** The Egyptian press is one of the most influential and widely read in the region, while Egyptian TV and the film industry supplies much of the Arab-speaking world with shows from its Media Production City. Press laws which allow prison sentences for libel have encouraged self-censorship on sensitive issues.
