- Christmas and New Year holidays are the most important.	- Tet (Lunar New Year) is the most important.
- Children sleep in their own bedrooms.	- Children often sleep with their parents.

TENSE TRANSFORMATION

1.

S + began/ started + **V-ing** / **To V** ... **in** + time(May, 1990,...)
time(years,month,..) + **ago**
→ S + { have/has + **Ved/3**..... } **since/ for** + time
have/has + been + **V-ing**.....

Ex: I started learning English five years ago.
→ I have been studying English for five years.

2.

S + have/ has + (**not**) + Ved/3..... for + **time**
→ It's + **time** + since + S + (**last**) + Ved/2

Ex: She *has lived* here for many years.
→ It's many years since she *lived* here.
I *haven't seen* him for two months.
→ It's two months since I *last saw* him.

3.

S + have/ has + **not** + Ved/3..... **for/ since** + time
→ a. **The last time** + S + Ved/2..... **was** + { time(years,month,..) + **ago**
in + time(May, 1990,...)
b. S + **last** + Ved/2 { time + **ago**
in + time

Ex: I haven't seen him for two months.
→ The last time I saw him was two months ago.
→ I last saw him two months ago.

4.

S + have/ has + (**not**) + **Ved/3**+ **since** + S + Ved/2
→ S + (**last**) **Ved/2** + **when** + S + Ved/2

Ex: John hasn't seen her since she left for Japan.
→ John last saw her when she left for Japan.

5.

S + have/ has + **not** + Ved/3.....**before**
→ It/this/that is **the first time** + S + have/ has + Ved/3

Ex: I haven't seen that man here before.

→ It is the first time I have seen that man here.

6.

How long { is it since + S + **Ved/2**.....?
 { have/ has + S + **Ved/3**.....?
→ When **did** + S + **V₀**.....?

Ex: How long is it since you sold this car?

→ When did you sell this car?
