Fossil fuels supply most of the energy consumed today. They are relatively concentrated, pure energy sources, technically easy to exploit, and provide cheap energy if the costs of pollution are ignored.

Pollution is a great problem. Fossil fuels contribute to global warming and acid rain. The use of fossil fuels, mainly coal, causes tens of thousands of deaths each year in the United States alone from ailments like respiratory disease, cardiovascular disease, and cancer. Both derivatives from the hydrocarbon fuel itself like carbon dioxide and impurities like heavy metals, sulfur, and uranium contribute to the pollution.

Carbon dioxide is also implicated as a major factor in global warming. To **ameliorate** the greenhouse gas emissions from burning fossil fuels, various techniques have been prepared for carbon sequestration. Carbon sequestration is the permanent capture and storage of carbon dioxide and other pollutants resulting from the combustion of fossil fuels. Such proposed solutions would increase

the cost of using fossil fuels. However, if the technologies were proven to be safe and acceptable to the public, they could allow the continued use of fossil fuels as the primary source of energy.
