DIRECT SPEECH AND REPORTED SPEECH

I. STATEMENTS

Study the following sentences carefully

- 1. She said to me "I am ill today."
- \rightarrow She *told* me (*that*) *she was* ill *that* day.
- 2. She said, "I hope you will stay here with me."
- → She said (*that*) *she hoped I would* stay *there* with *her*.
- 3. I often say to her, "I'll do anything for you now."
- \rightarrow I often *tell* her (*that*) I'll do anything for *her* now.

RULES

How to change direct speech into reported speech.

1. Change *say to* into *tell*

said to into told.

- 2. Omit the *comma (,)*
- 3. Change the *inverted commas ("")* into *THAT* (possibly omitted)
- 4. Change **Pronouns and Possessive Adjectives**
 - The 1st person (I, me, my, mine we, us, our, ours) becomes the same person as *SUBJECT* of the introductory verb.
 - The 2nd person (you, your, yours) becomes the same person as *OBJECT* of the introductory verb.
 - The 3rd person won't change.
- 5. Change *verb TENSES* if the introductory verb is *PAST*

PRESENT TENSES become PAST TENSES

- SIMPLE PRESENT	- SIMPLE PAST
\rightarrow walk	\rightarrow walked
- PRESENT CONTINOUS	- PAST CONTINOUS
\rightarrow is walking	\rightarrow was walking
- PAST CONTINOUS	- PAST PERFECT CONTINOUS
\rightarrow was walking	\rightarrow had been walking
- PRESENT PERFECT	
\rightarrow had walked	- PAST PERFECT
- SIMPLE PAST	\rightarrow had walked
\rightarrow walked	
- SIMPLE FUTURE	- CONDITIONAL PRESENT
\rightarrow will walk	\rightarrow would walk
- CONDITIONAL PRESENT	- CONDITIONAL PERFECT
\rightarrow would walk	\rightarrow would have walked
- PAST PERFECT	
\rightarrow had walked	- WON'T CHANGE
- CONDITIONAL PERFECT	- WON I CHANGE
\rightarrow would have walked

II. QUESTIONS

Examine the following sentences carefully

- 1. She said to me "Are you ready to go now?"
- \rightarrow She *asked* me *if I was* ready to go *then*.
- 2. I said, "Where are you going now, Mary?
- → I *asked* Mary where *she was* going *then*.
- 3. She usually says to me, "What time is it now?"
- \rightarrow She usually *asks* me what time *it is* now.

RULES

- 1. Change say (to) into ASK, WONDER, WANT TO KNOW
- 2. Omit the *comma (,)*
- 3. Change the *inverted commas ("")* into *IF / WHETHER... OR* when the question begins with a verb.
- 4. Change **Pronouns and Possessive Adjectives**
- 5. Put the Subject before the Verb.
- 6. Change verb TENSES if the introductory verb is PAST
- 7. Change some words denoting *TIME or PLACE*
- 8. Change the question mark (?) into a period (.).

III. COMMANDS

Examine the following pairs of sentences carefully

- 1. She said, "Help me with this stuck window, Bob."
- → She *asked* Robert *to help her* with *that* stuck window.
- 2. She said to me, "Don't smoke too much now."
- → She *advised* me *not to smoke* too much *then*.
- 3. She said, "Please forgive me, Mom."
- → She *begged* her mother *to forgive her*.
- 4. The officer always says to his men, "Never turn your backs to your enemies."
- → The officer always *commands* his men *never to turn their* backs to *their* enemies.

RULES

- 1. Change say (to) into ASK, REQUEST, SUGGEST, ADVISE, BEG, WARN, REMIND, ORDER, COMMAND, GIVE ORDER TO.
- 2. Omit the comma (,)
- 3. Omit the *inverted commas ("")*
- 4. Change the imperative Verb into *TO-infinitive*
 - Omit *PLEASE*
 - Put *NOT/NEVER* before *TO-infinitive*
- 5. Change Pronouns and Possessive Adjectives
- 6. Change some words denoting *TIME or PLACE*
